

This Quick Guide provides a brief overview of floor and wall-mounted locker installation instructions. It be housed behind and/or within your walls and floor. Do not attempt this installation if you are unsure ...

Basic installation process: Lockers are unloaded and hardware kit is located. Lockers are set in place, level and plumb, secured to wall and bolted to each other. Doors checked for function, lock operation ...

When lockers are securely attached to the wall, they can be positioned at an ideal height for users, reducing strain when opening and closing them. This contributes to a more user-friendly ...

Place the lockers against the wall and align them with your markings. It's easier with two people, especially for larger banks. Insert the appropriate wall anchors, screws, or bolts as needed. Always ...

Locker banks should be centered on each wall with a minimum of 3" space between the last locker and the wall on each side so that the locker doors can function properly.

A common question we receive is whether our staff lockers can be anchored to the floor or wall. In this short article, we'll provide an answer to this query while highlighting the reasons for our locker design ...

Assembled lockers only need to be placed in their correct locations. Metal lockers must be mounted against a wall for safety purposes and they generally must be attached to one another.

Securing Lockers more lockers must be fixed together side by side. Make sure the unit is securely in position and bolt together side by side. Use 4 no. 6 x 12mm nesting nuts and bolts into the 4 pre ...
