

China's Ministry of Industry and Information Technology (MIIT) has announced new mandatory national safety standards for electric vehicle batteries that will take effect on July 1, 2026.

Increased safety regulations in the EV space are inevitable, and the new ones out of China come just after the country announced new testing requirements for autonomous driving systems.
