The property owner is required to sign a lease for a period of time that is long enough to ensure that the solar panel company generates a sufficient return on investment.

During the lease period, the landowner's rights to use the leased property will be severely limited. The solar company will require near complete control of the leased property to protect its solar project and ...

Beginning September 1, 2026, residential solar retailers and solar salespersons must be registered with TDLR to conduct sales or leases of residential solar panels and residential solar energy systems.

Homeowners may 1) renew the lease, 2) request the PV system be removed, or 3) purchase the system at fair market value. Fair market value is a price determined by a third-party appraiser at the time the system is sold.

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
