In 2019, the government announced plans to build two solar energy plants--in Myingyan and Wundwin in Mandalay Division --each to have a generation capacity of 150 MW.

During the 2024-2025 financial year, solar home systems are being implemented in villages within Shan State (East) and Ayeyawady Region using over K8 billion from the Union Budget Fund, ...

In remote areas with limited access to the national power grid, electricity is being supplied using multiple methods, including solar energy, small-scale hydropower plants, and power plants fueled by wind and diesel.

According to the 2024 census, 51.6 per cent of rural areas now have access to electricity. In terms of energy sources, 30.2 per cent of rural power consumption comes from renewable energy, of which ...

The Myanmar government is undertaking a significant energy transformation, prioritizing the use of renewable energy to expand rural electrification as outlined in its National Electrification Master Plan.

Local homes and businesses have seen a 50% decrease in energy costs with the new solar mini-grid, while public facilities receive the electricity for free. In addition, the solar system eliminates the daily use of diesel ...
