In the National Stratégie Energétique Horizon 2030, the renewable energy ratio will be set at 30% in 2030 as an energy mix with primary energy from the viewpoint of energy security, which is positioned ...

Construction works are expected to begin in 2024 and be completed in 2028. Once finished, the project will help expand European access to renewable energy.

In Tunisia, over 95% of electricity generation relies on gas, while all renewable sources--hydropower, solar, and wind--combined account for about 4% only (Figure 1). The ...
