Certain Passengers needing special accommodations will be able to self-identify digitally prior to their day of travel, with special service requests (SSRs)--like wheelchair assistance--visible ...

Travelers who don't present an acceptable form of ID to TSA agents will now be able to pay ahead of time or at the airport -- but it doesn't mean they're guaranteed to fly.

One travel companion will be permitted to board with a Customer with a disability who qualifies to preboard. Learn more about requesting a specific seat to accommodate your disability.

If you are someone who needs additional time or assistance to board the plane, stow your accessibility equipment, or be seated you qualify as someone who can use preboarding.

The purpose of section 382.93 is to afford passengers with disabilities who are entitled to preboard enough time and space to board, stow their accessibility equipment, or be seated safely.

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
